"If Christ is in you, your body is dead because of sin, yet your spirit is alive because of righteousness." (Romans 8:10)

Paul, in his letter to the church at Rome, is writing to the Christians to encourage them in their faith. He spent much of his time in his letters explaining his own understanding of discipleship and for him it had to do with a state of mind. If a person's mind is in Christ then they are more apt to follow the way of Christ in worship and service. But if a person's mind is primarily focused in personal pursuits then they are more apt to be on a self-centered path. Each way is a different highway. There is, however, one thing for certain. There is no way for any of us to get out of this life alive. Death of the physical is unavoidable no matter what you believe. But when it comes to the spirit of a person, that's another matter entirely. The Spirit as a life source is alive in our world because of the righteousness of God revealed in His Son Jesus Christ. It is possible and indeed preferable to live for Christ. For as Paul came to put it in his own life, "It is not I who lives, but Christ who liveth in me."

Prayer: Oh God tune my heart to Your heart. Draw me closer to Your will and way. Show me the freedom that comes when I no longer live for self, but live for You. Help me to seek the mind of Christ in all things. In His holy name, Amen.
