Another form of service/ministry is much less formal, Visiting the Homebound or those in assisted living facilities. The church ministers make these visits, but there are several church members who call as well. This also includes visiting the hospital. In addition, some church members may need a ride to a doctor, from the hospital or elsewhere. These members, often without much outside support, are thankful for the church members of our family of faith who reach out with caring to offer a ride or just a visit.

One last program is the Prayer in the Chapel Ministry. During the 11:00 worship service in the Sanctuary, two volunteers remain in the chapel praying. They pray for the three worship services of the church, for the ministers, for the church programs, for the hospitalized/ill, for the homebound and those in assisted living, for the military and their families, for our government and our leaders and for many other daily concerns. It is a reaching out to God about all these concerns, ministries and missions of the church.

Pastoral Care at Highland Presbyterian Church

Pastoral Care is responsible for many volunteer opportunities in a wide variety of mission/service situations. These opportunities allow individuals to share God's love as well as their own personal care and concern as they represent our shole church with their volunteering. Highland has a place for many members to reach out individually and collectively to witness for Him.

One opportunity is through Crisis Care Committee. After a funeral/graveside service, this committee often provides refreshments for a reception, usually in the Fellowship Hall for the family and out of town guests. Crisis Care gives the bereaved family a chance to receive and speak with visitors. It is a time of fellowship that the volunteers and Crisis Care Committee help make possible as the church and members express love and caring through the preparing and serving of the funeral fellowship food. If you are interested in reaching out in this capacity, please contact Pat Parrott.

Another area of Pastoral Care is the Care for Military Families. Consulting with a few active duty spouses, they have expressed a desire to feel at home/included in Highland Presbyterian Church, to have good children's programs available, and to reinstall a Sponsor program. This past May 26th, Highland had a Honor the Military Wednesday night dinner program. All active duty members and families were guests of the church. There was entertainment and even door prizes. Anyone interested in serving and expressing care in this area of the church's life, please contact Carol Ivey. There certainly is room for many other persons to be involved.

An additional area of serving is with the Flower Ministry Committee. Each Monday, the Flower Ministry volunteers seperate the flowers from the altar arrangement and make smaller arrangements that are then taken to shut-ins and the ill. Receiving flowers from the church is much appreciated. It means contact from the church and personal contact from the one delivering the flowers. Please speak with Flo Edwards if you are interested in this ministry.

Stephen Ministry is just one more way in which you can serve on the Pastoral Care Team. Stephen Ministry is done very privately, without fanfare, often unknown and unrecognized by others. We often have members who are dealing with some of the most difficult times in their lives. They are often alone or with limited contacts, and they appreciate being able to count on visits from a listening and caring friend; a trained Stephen Minister. Stephen Ministers are significantly trained in listening, in dealing with special situations, and in loving and caring as a Christian friend. Required training is available for people interested in being a Stephen Minister. Training is offered this Fall at Hay Street United Methodist Church. The probable dates are from August 31, 2010 - January 25, 2011. This is a 21 session training spanning over 18 weeks (Thanksgiving week and 3 weeks at Christmas off). Another Training session will be available at First Presbyterian starting October 3rd. If you are interested in becoming a Stephen Minister give Elva Owen or Doc Wyle a call.
