A few lines my friends...

To comment on a couple of items that I have found interesting and which might be of interest to us as a church family.

First, was an article that appeared in this past Monday's paper about Pauline Jones Elementary School and how the Principal, faculty and staff working with the children have literally turned the test scores in that school around. Pauline Jones is located in one of the poorest parts of our city and has for years been one of the lowest performing schools in the Cumberland Country School System. Through a very creative initiative involving school personnel, retired teachers, churches, and other community leaders, the students of Pauline Jones have literally been surrounded by a team approach to address the needs of each child, and the results are amazing. This past round of testing showed that 80% of the students passed at least one of the year end proficiency tests in reading or math, up from 35% last year. The result means that the future of these children is much brighter.

Second is to share with you an action that your Session took at it's meeting in June. I, along with Georgeanna English and Alecia Paschal attended a special grant information session with the Partnership for Children to hear about a community team approach for another of our schools with a high number of "at-risk" children, T.C. Berrian Elementary. In a partnership involving the Principal, faculty and staff of the school, along with churches, day care centers and Learning Centers such as ours, and the Partnership For Children, we have the opportunity to be a part of a great effort to impact the lives of children in a very special way. The grant application process will take some time and hopefully it will be awarded and we can be a part of this purposeful and missional effort as a congregation. As Jesus, Himself said, "Let the children come unto me, for of such is the kingdom of heaven."

I hope you're having a great summer with family and with friends. I am grateful for your continuing financial support through the summer months. Your regular giving in service, worship, and pledge is what keeps this church strong. Let us together pray for God's work in the world, for peace in our time, and for unity in the body of Christ the world over.

The Highland Family and Missions

This week we will be featuring Caleb Byerly

Shirley Barbour's grandson, Caleb, is back in the Philippines with the Tigwahanon tribe in the Iglugsad village on his own personal mission. He has been there for a few months and is spreading the Word and God's love in so many ways.

Along with some locals, he has helped to construct a workshop in



which to build instruments native to the area. As Caleb would tell you, the first day of work on the workshop was disastrous! A coconut tree that they needed for the build was cut down and it fell on to their neighbors house, totally demolishing it! They rebuilt the house, with many people from the village joining in to help and then they were able to get back to completing the construction

of the workshop.

Caleb has set-up a schedule with the locals to learn how to use the needed tools, to learn about wood and how to use it, to learn about the instruments and most importantly, how to use these instruments to worship God. There are seven men working on rotating shifts every six days. They are excited about re-establishing the art of making their own instruments.



Others from the village have joined in the process by donating their trees to use for drums and flutes. What isn't donated, they are having to find by hiking through the mountains, with axes in hand, chopping trees into pieces and then throwing the pieces onto their shoulders to carry back down to the village.

They have carved out three different types of drums using basic tools and have settled on a bamboo that will be great for the native flutes.

Caleb and another missionary friend put their heads together and designed a pedal-bike-powered grinder for making hand tools and sharpening the tools. (It's a grinder powered by someone pedaling a small bike). Caleb is training someone on how to sharpen tools the correct way and if all goes well, they will start a small business. All of the income will go to pay for gas for a motorbike that Caleb purchased for their ministry to the outer villages.



These are just a few of the physical ministries Caleb has been doing. Caleb is also teaching the Manobo's to find their identity in God from the Old Testament. He believes it is important for them to understand who they are in God and that the Old Testament helps to understand the nature of God.

Caleb has seen the "release" in many of their hearts and is joyful. He would like for everyone to continue to believe with him and to continue to pray for him as he works in God with the Manobo people.
