A few lines my friends...

to give you an up-date on progress to date on the Purpose/Missional approach to Ministry at Highland. This is really a tool for identifying our PURPOSE for our church and for then being intentional about our ministry around that purpose. The expanded committee continues to meet and a Speaker's Bureau has been formed to visit all the groups (Sunday School, Choir, Highland Men, Presbyterian Women, Flingers, Second Mile, etc.) to invite them to participate in a process that will lead us closer to defining our Purpose as a church.

A Purpose Statement is much like a Mission Statement and it helps us determine what we will do and also what we do not need to be doing in our common life together. In the Purposeful/Missional Concept there are five key areas of ministry: Worship, Fellowship, Mission (Evangelism), Ministry, and Education.

The goal in a Purpose Driven Church is to raise up disciples for Jesus Christ by equipping members to use their gifts (what they love to do), in service to Jesus Christ. Doesn't it make sense that you find out what you love to do and then consider how you might use what you love to do to strengthen the church.

Maybe it's the gift of hospitality (you're a people person), maybe it's the gift of caring (you can bring comfort at the point of need), maybe it's teaching (sharing the faith with someone who is wanting to know more), maybe it's with children (because you love their energy and eagerness to learn), maybe it's administration (because you love to organize and help things go successfully), maybe it's through worship and music (because you love to share in that way), maybe it's going out into the community (for there you find joy in helping someone needing help), maybe it's in helping the church with it's financial management or encouraging members in estate planning (because you realize that without a plan a lot of what a person might like to happen won't). And all these ways of serving are a part of serving Jesus Christ.

Also, part of the Purposeful/Missional Concept is providing support and encouragement for members engaged in ministry through small Life Groups. The joy of the Christian life is found in service to Christ, pure and simple and the goal then becomes equipping and supporting the membership as they find ways of serving. Please pray for our church, for the way God is wanting to use us to be light and salt to the earth, for the message we have to share of the Good News of Christ with others. Pray that he might help you as you think about where he wants you to serve or to undergird you now where you ARE serving. And in everything give thanks to God for His amazing grace, forgiveness and love.
